Dear Family and Friends,

Last month, the Lord in his divine plan called us to serve Him in Bamenda, Cameroon.

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then I said, Here I am, send me." (Isaiah 6:8).

For reasons that are beyond our understanding, God led us back to Cameroon. The mission trip was difficult and challenging as we were carrying more than twenty large boxes of medicine plus our mobile dental and medical clinic equipment. Whether in Africa, Europe, or Russia the people are similar and the needs are the same, and you cannot miss the pain and suffering of many. There are many infectious and epidemic diseases such as parasites, malaria, and tuberculosis are prominent due to poor conditions and lack of clean purified water. **Innocent children with many illnesses, malnutrition, and anemia break your heart.**

We realized why the Lord brought us to these misfortunate areas. In Bamenda we started the day with worship, prayer, and preaching the gospel before seeing patients. Steve, one of our team members, touched the hearts of many by playing the guitar and singing hymns. Hundreds of

people accepted Christ as their Savior. Thousands of people came as early as 5:00 in the morning to receive



treatment and medicine to relieve some of their physical needs. Others had psychological and financial needs and we did our best to fulfill all their needs whatever they might be.



We were invited to some villages like Ngie and Bamuboh, about 60 miles away and in very mountainous areas. We traveled for about four hours each way on rocky dirt roads full of holes, which made it very difficult as we had all of our equipment and medicines tied to the top of the vehicle.

When we arrived in the villages, the chief and mayor received us with enthusiasm and with open hearts to provide them with medical and dental care and to bring the good news of the gospel. Unfortunately, meningitis was epidemic and about 20 people had died in Ngie. We used all of the antibiotics that we had, but they were not enough.

The mayor of the village of Ngie had his heart touched by the Lord and offered to give land to build a mission clinic, carrying our name, Worldwide Medical-Dental Evangelical Mission, as a center to provide medical and dental treatment and to preach the gospel. This is such a blessing because the people of Ngie have to travel at least four hours if they need medical or dental treatment.

Every Sunday morning and evening I was invited to preach in various churches in Bamenda.



The churches were packed with people hungry to hear the word of God and many accepted Christ as their Savior. I was touched when the Pastor of Grace Church asked me to dedicate a baby to the Lord and after the service the women of the church prepared a lunch on our behalf.

In spite of our busy schedule of providing medical and dental treatment and

dispensing medicine, we gave lectures and seminars in the Center for Biblical Studies, a bible school in Bamenda, and the



Missionary Institute for Health and Development, a school which teaches both medicine and nursing skills and bible training. We

were able to provide this nursing school with a much-needed microscope, blood pressure cuffs and stethoscopes, and medicines, also.

Before our departure their eyes were filled with tears and they did not want to let us go and they stayed and had fellowship with us until late into the evening. All of the people of Cameroon asked me to convey to you and our great country their appreciation and gratitude for your support and contribution. In fact, "The harvest is truly plentiful, but the laborers are few." (Luke 10:2)

I plead with you to remember us in your prayers and help us to buy medicine and necessities for those who are in desperate need. We would be blessed, as well, if you join us for any of our next mission trips to Romania, Russia, Africa, or Peru. "He who has pity on the poor lends to the Lord, and He will pay back what he has given." (Proverbs 19:17)

May the Lord bless you abundantly.
